It is the first day of the rest of our lives.

I don't know where to begin. There are so many angles to look at.

Believe in God? Yes.

Understand God's presence? Not completely. Not even partially. But I am fascinated with every insight.

If we are being truthful—our whole life as spiritual beings can be a prayer. Truth beyond us—truth within us. Be patient—look for what is not understandable. Stand present with it. Answers will come. God's "no" has a "yes" sometimes. What draws us to prayer may be a many splendored thing. Sometimes our own needs—sometimes our hope for others.

Remember, pray for self and for others. Pray for the world. The magic in prayer is in loving much. Trust that there is value in opening self in prayer. Prayer has to do with our being in Christ. Prayer is who we hope to become.

Change and life are inseparable—letting go, giving up. Rocks, stones, mountains and valleys are all movable. There is nothing permanent but change. Change is not without discomfort. Even from worse to better. Cooperate with change. Surrender is a choice.

That is true right now. Pray unceasingly.
